- Improve the effectiveness and efficiency of Cal U's pre-award and post-award processes

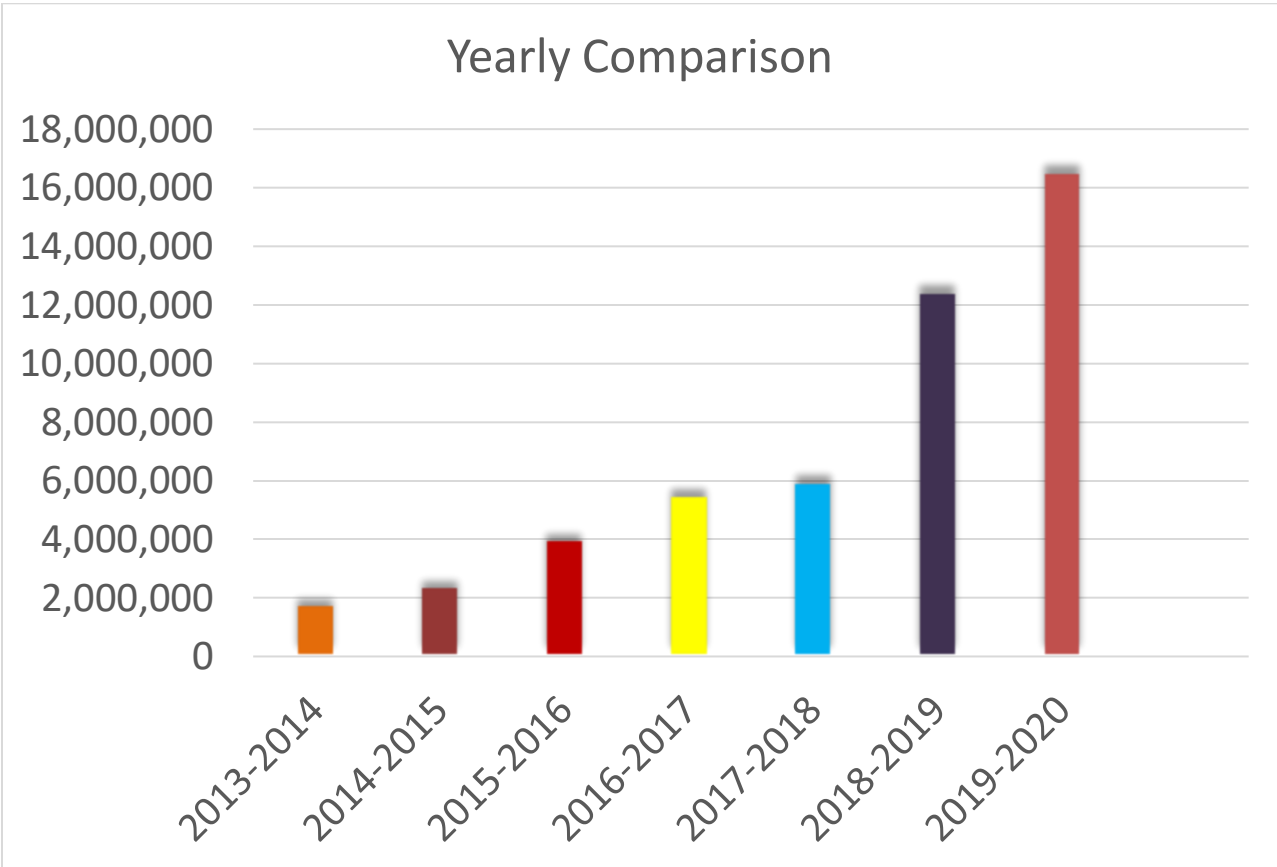
2019-2020 Activities:

 - 1 staff member from Administration and Finance

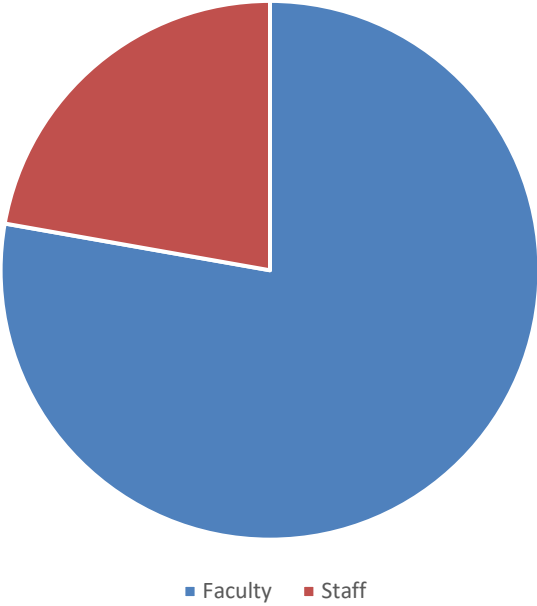
Funded awards included federal, state, and private.

Yearly Comparison

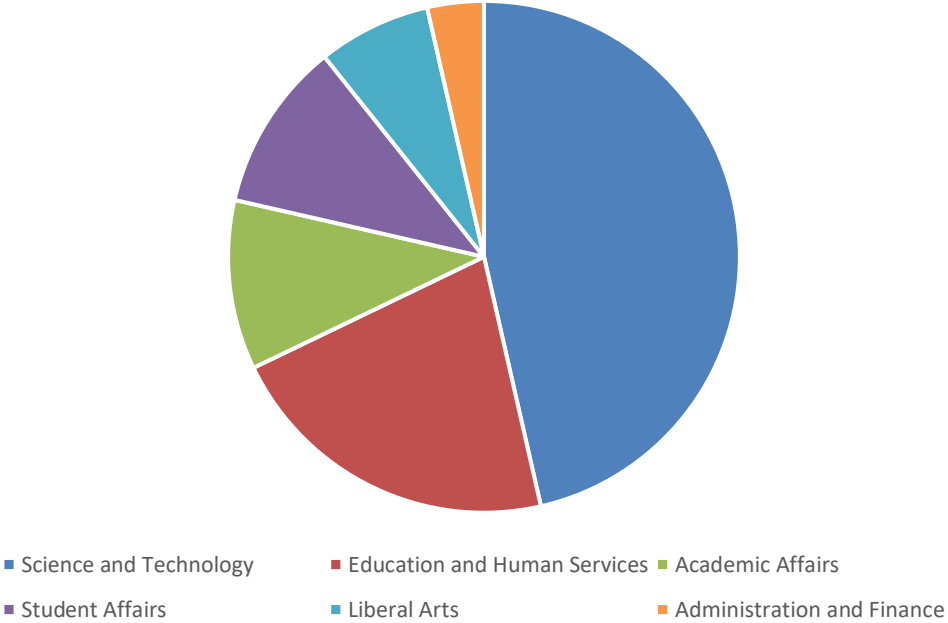

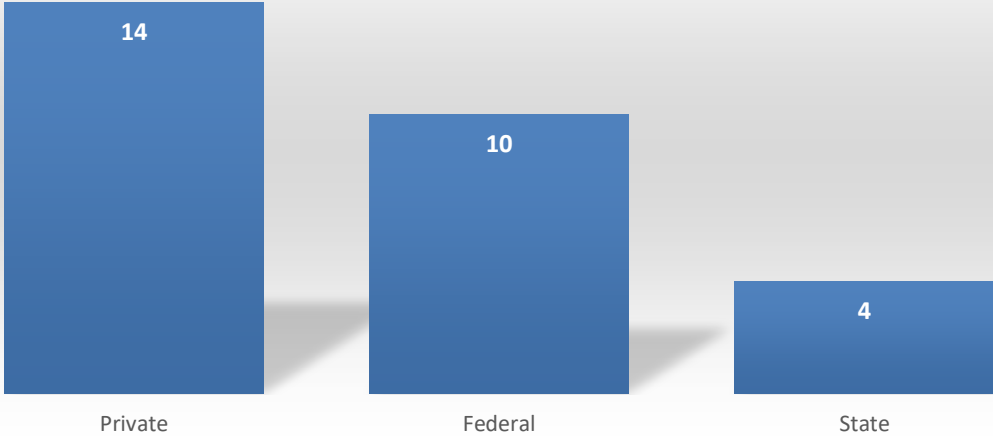

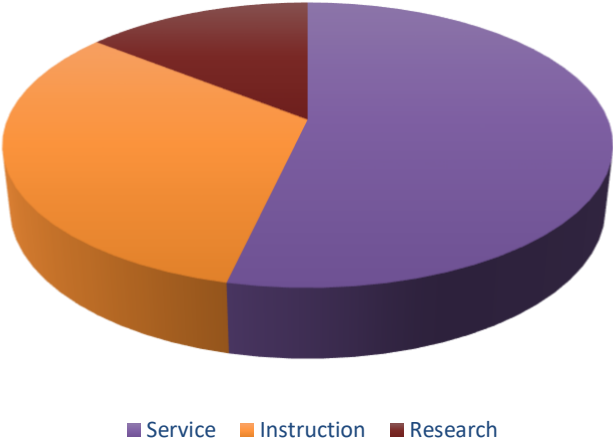
Grant Writers by Colleges/Division
