

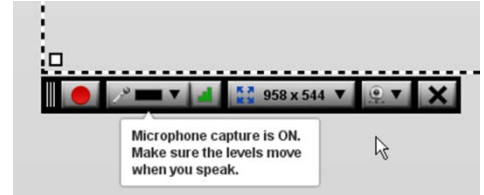


Using Screen Capture Video Feedback with Captions in Your Online Courses

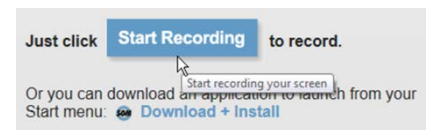
1. Open a screen capture video program (Screencast-o-matic (SOM), free version program).
 - a. You may need to make a new account
2. SOM permit to save video files as MP4 <http://www.screencast-o-matic.com/>
 - a. Screencast-o-matic requires JAVA <http://youtu.be/KnoioSQU3Wg>
 - b. Can save as MP4
 - c. MP4 can be uploaded to YouTube



3. Screencast-o-matic tutorial <http://youtu.be/5IIxeigN9L8>
 - a. Capture a video with narration
 - b. Use Webcam



4. Practice taking a screen capture video
 - a. Select start recording
 - b. Resize capture window by selecting corner handles
 - c. Select record button (red button)
 - d. Select done when finished
 - e. Select how to save file (SOM, YouTube, computer)
 - f. Save to SOM - Post link (COPY first and paste) into a document or LMS
5. Test microphone settings
 - a. Select Jing setting icon
 - b. Select audio input



6. Saving your MP4 video to the web to YouTube
 - a. Using <http://www.youtube.com/>
 - b. Need to set up a free account
 - c. Upload MP4
 - d. Directions for uploading to YouTube
 - i. <http://youtu.be/Jqt0xamvNLO>



7. Insert the video link (or the embed code) into your LMS
 - a. Note: When inserting embed code, you will need to access the HTML code page or insert via a widget
 - b. <http://goo.gl/TRhQ6>

8. Adding captions to YouTube videos.
 - a. In video manager select Edit → Captions
 - b. Click on the caption track you would like to edit
 - c. Click inside any line in the caption track panel. Note that you can edit the text, but not the timing.
 - d. Edit text while listening to the video
 - e. Save when you're finished
